The difference between the University and the Student Union

Student or Employee?

Being a PhD student is exciting and rewarding, but it's also a uniquely weird, and often quite complex, position to be in.

You are both employed and a student. When are you what? And when should you turn to who? And what is the difference between the University and the Student Union?

Firstly, it's important to understand that the Student Union and the University are two different organisations, each with its own responsibilities and areas of focus.

The University is your employer and is responsible for employment conditions, and maintaining both good academic and work environments. In your case, this includes matters related to employment conditions and the broader work setting.

The Student Union, on the other hand, represents the student body. Our role is to advocate for students' perspectives on issues such as education, student welfare, and overall student experience.

**If you're ever unsure
- ask us!**

The Student Union can only represent you when you are acting in your capacity as a student, not as an employee, but understanding the difference can be tricky.

Depending on which situation you are in you should either turn to the University or the Student Union.


Meet Other PhD Students at Fun Events?



The Chalmers Student Experience



Being a student at Chalmers can be quite a unique experience. Here are the most common and traditional elements of Chalmers long student life, explained.

5 big things if you are a Chalmers student...



"Sittning"

A "sittning" is a cherished tradition at many Swedish universities – a lively student dinner filled with food, songs, and toasts. At Chalmers, many of the student divisions adds its own unique twist with special traditions and homegrown songs.

Pub Crawl

After each exam period there is a campus pub crawl. Most divisions open up their own pub and students walk around campus collecting stamps by visiting each pub. A fun way to feel like a student and get a pause from your daily work while meeting other PhD students.

The Chalmers Cap

Our beloved Chalmers cap has topped heads since 1878, switching from black in winter to white in summer during The Changing of the Chalmers Cap (Mösspåtagningen) by the Ceremony Committee (Marsalkämbetet).

Each spring, students pin on a mayflower, one for every year at Chalmers. A common misconception about the Chalmers cap is that you must graduate before wearing it. In fact, all Student Union members have the right to wear their cap.

CM - Chalmers Championship

The Championships are held annually, often organized within the student divisions. There are championships in everything from sports to beer chugging, with varying levels of seriousness – but fun nonetheless.

Spex & Chalmersspexet

Since 1948 Chalmersspexet has put on spex – an annual musical comedy show filled with student inside jokes about life at Chalmers and being a Chalmers student. Each performance is themed around a historical or mythological figure or event.

3 Events to Look Forward To!

Chalmers Run (Chalmersloppet)

Walk, jog, run or sprint. Each spring Chalmers Studentkårs Teknologbolag host a running race for students and Chalmers employees with different routes from 3 to 10 km.

The Cortège

A beloved Chalmers and Gothenburg tradition dating back to 1909 – an annual, humor-filled student-built parade taking place in the end of April. Join the PhD team and fellow students during Build Week to help bring the spectacle to life.



CHARM

CHARM is one of Scandinavia's leading career fairs that is arranged every February at Campus Johanneberg. For two whole days, you have the opportunity to network and meet over 150 companies.



The Chalmers Lingo



Hundreds of posters with words you don't understand? Meeting at Olgas Trappor but no clue where that is? Sort of the same generation, yet speaking completely different languages? There is a certain "lingo" here – tricky to follow, but we'll help you out.

EMIL & EMILIA

Emil and Emilia are the nicknames for male and female students at Chalmers. Emil originated in 1933 and Emilia in the 1940's.

NOLLAN = FRESHMEN

You are "Nollan" your first day at Chalmers and during the orientation period, before taking your first university credit

TEKNOLOG = STUDENT

All students at Chalmers are *Teknologer*, a word describing someone that studies to be an engineer.

AVANCEZ

French for (roughly) *Go forward* or *Advance* and is the motto of Chalmers University and the Student Union.

GASQUE

Is a nightclub-like party. It may also refer to the Student Union nightclub which is called Gasquen.

PHADDER = MENTOR

Being a mentor to a student starting at Chalmers.

LIVET ÄR HÄRLIGT

A song from a historical Spex held in 1959 meaning "Life is wonderful". It has evolved to become a beloved song that all student dinners (sittning) begin with.

GÜCKEL = JESTING

Entertainment at student dinners such as sketches, songs, and funny stories – yes almost anything, really.

SKYDDSHELGON = PATRON SAINT

Most student divisions have a patron saint, as a mascot sort of. That is the reason you sometimes see a lot of Snoopy, Donald Duck and James Bond around campus.

ASPA = ASPIRE

Aspiring period is a time were a committee shows its activities and events and potential members can try it. Taking part in that is called "Aspa".

ARRA = ARRANGE

Arra is short for arranging in Swedish and is often used by committees and societies when arranging an event on campus.

OLGAS TRAPPOR = OLGAS STAIRS

The stairs going from the SU Building to Chalmers Tvärgata honoring Olga Boberg, a Chalmers icon.



History lesson!

Let's Reminisce...

The Student Union was founded in 1904 to represent the students' interests, especially regarding their studies. What has happened since? Here are some highlights that have left their mark on our history.



1937: Sports Cabin in Härryda has its grand opening. (more info on p. 23)

1952: After a year of building, The Student Union Building is inaugurated.

1960: At that time, the 50 female students had enough and founded the student association Emilia, expanding the concept of Emil to Emil and Emilia.

1970: First Student Union Council Election (FuM) takes place.

1989: The Student Union is awarded the Chalmers Medal for its valuable contribution to the University.

2008: Exams are anonymized after close collaboration with the University, with the union playing a key role in making it happen.

2010: The Chalmers board decided that mandatory membership will stay, highlighting its importance for education quality, networking, and the University's global appeal.

Who Calls the Shots?

Put simply – you & everyone else.

Every member has the right to participate in the organisation's decision-making.

However, with nearly 14,000 members, direct involvement isn't practical. Therefore, to ensure transparency and democracy, we have a Student Council.

All paying members can run for a seat, and each year 35 representatives are elected. They decide on key issues like the Student Union fee, major student policies, budget, strategic paths and appoint committee members.




